4. Presidents Remarks

Welcome to all those in-person and online. It is truly wonderful to re-connect with you, our members, our supporters, our community. We are pleased to be hosting this years Annual General Meeting at St. Peter's Anglican Church Erindale, who are celebrating their 200th anniversary in 2025.

Heritage Mississauga connects with its community in many ways – Constant Contact, Facebook, Twitter (my favourite), Instagram, YouTube and online gatherings. 2024 was an exceptional year for heritage celebration across the city as we honoured our city's 50th anniversary. We developed a travelling exhibition launched at the Canada Pavilion Carassauga which was showcased at several festivals throughout the year: Bread and Honey Festival, Polish Days Festival, Viva Goa Festival, Buskerfest and Italfest. We hosted a 50 for 50-week podcast on our channel Heritage Bytes and published 52 articles in Modern Mississauga celebrating 50 years of heritage. As part of the special celebrations, we held the 2024 Legend's Row induction ceremony at the Living Arts Centre welcoming two years of inductees: for 2023, Gayle Bothwick, Jason Spezza and Pat Bullard and for 2024, Amanda Cleghorn, John Roberts and Simu Liu. At *the Credits* we honoured 49 "Heritage Heroes" with over 450 members of the community.

Heritage Mississauga, thanks to its members, sponsors and the Community at large, has never been more fiscally sound. We have become the benchmark for which other organizations are measured by.

Our staff is second to none. Our thanks to Executive Director Jayme Gaspar, Historian Matthew Wilkinson, Culture Heritage|Creative Strategist Meghan Mackintosh, Collections and Resource Lead Justine Lyn and Social Media & Communications Coordinator Melissa Toste for their hard work and dedication to the organization. 2024 also brought a change to our staff lineup, we said goodbye to Justine Lyn and welcomed Madeleine Henry. Our Board is drawn from a wide cross-section of the business world and is dedicated to ensuring Heritage Mississauga fulfills its mandate.

The President then summarized the accomplishments over the last year, accompanied by a slide presentation. The following is a summary of his comments:

We continued our weekly programs including, LIVE (communicating events and programs across the city and GTA), Wayback Wednesday's article with partner Modern Mississauga Media, Ask A Historian and Saturday Matinee's. Through our Social Media Network with daily posts, we have celebrated, connected the community, captured moments in time, and connected with a broad audience.

We expanded our Indigenous programming hosting two webinars with guest speaker, Carolyn King and hosted the Sunrise Equinox Ceremony in March. We appreciate the support of the Rotary Club of Mississauga and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation for their sponsorship of these programs. Throughout the year we recognized National Day for Truth & Recognition, Treaties Recognition Week, Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women & Girls, Red Dress Day and Orange Shirt Day

We received funds through the Ontario Trillium Foundation Capital Grant to improve the kitchen and install much needed lighting and hand drying stations. We were also successful in securing an Ontario Trillium Foundation SEED grant for an Indigenous Oral History program.

Our 1812 re-enactment Company hosted drill days, and represented our community at the Battle of Fort Erie, Stoney Creek and Queenston Heights re-enactment weekends. They participated in the Caledon Canada Day celebration, hosted Engagement at Bradley and supported Remembrance Day ceremonies in the community laying wreaths honouring 1812 Veterans.

Douglas expressed his thanks to fellow Directors and Heritage Mississauga Staff for their support during the last year, as we continued to provide heritage content and programming to a broader audience and ensured that we were able to celebrate the unique and diverse heritage of our community.
